LIFTING OF DENGUE EPIDEMIC DECLARATION

Currently, the recent data collected from the continuous monitoring of cases by the surveillance systems placed by the Department of Health shows that cumulative number of reported cases for dengue from January 1, 2020 to January 11, 2020 was determined at 6,551 cases, including 11 deaths with 0.32% Case Fatality Rate. As of Morbidity Week 2 (January 5- January 11, 2020), a steady decline of cases have been observed in all regions. As of January 24, 2020, Dengue Surveillance Reports have shown that:


- A. No regions exceeded the alert threshold
- B. No regions exceeded the epidemic threshold

Lifting and termination of the Dengue Epidemic can be declared at the regional, municipal or city level by their respective Epidemiology and Surveillance Units when there is an observed continuing decreasing trend to the number of cases four (4) consecutive weeks from the last known case in the area as stipulated in the National Dengue Response Plan.

However, Regional Dengue Coordinators are still requested to continuously submit their reports and inventory based on **Administrative Order No. 2018-0021: "Guidelines for the Nationwide Implementation of the Enhanced 4S-Strategy against Dengue, Chikungunya and Zika"** and **Department Memorandum No. 2019-0315: National Dengue Epidemic**. These reports would be strictly monitored by the National Dengue Prevention and Control Program.

In addition, continuous advocacy and sustained implementation of the Enhanced 4S-Strategies should be monitored:

- Search and destroy mosquito-breeding sites.
- Self-protection measures (e.g. wearing long pants and long-sleeved shirts, and daily use of mosquito repellents)
- Seek early consultation
- Support fogging/spraying only in hotspot areas where increase in cases is registered for two consecutive weeks to prevent an impending outbreak.
