#### REGIONAL SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS ON CHILDREN (RSAC) SURVEY GUIDE

#### I. SURVEY INFORMATION

The Council for the Welfare of Children (CWC) developed the "Makabatang Survey" to gather information about the different issues and concerns of children according to the four (4) categories of their rights – survival, development, protection, and participation. It also includes questions on governance, which is essential in ensuring that duty bearers implement programs, policies, and activities to uphold children's rights in the regions.

The survey contains ten (10) sections. The respondent may access the questions on the categories of rights and governance from sections five (5) to nine (9) of the survey. CWC added additional sections to get insights on children's issues during the pandemic and recommendations to address issues identified under the four (4) categories of children's rights.

The survey takes approximately 30 to 45 minutes to complete online and offline. The survey is available only in Filipino. CWC recommends that the survey be conducted by the RS/SCWC Secretariat, PSWDO or PCPC in one sitting.

The results of the survey shall serve as an additional input to the Regional Situation Analysis on Children (RSAC) that the regions will develop through its Regional Committees and Sub-Committees for the Welfare of Children (RC/SCWC)

#### II. SURVEY POPULATION AND SAMPLE

The respondents to the survey shall be children who are residents of the region and whose ages are between 07 to 17. Children from different sectors such as children in school, out-of-school youth, Muslim children, and others (refer to survey outline for a list of children sectors) shall be given an equal opportunity by the survey administrators to participate in the survey.

Since the survey is qualitative in nature, non-probability sampling shall be employed, specifically, purposive sampling. Each region shall have a minimum of fifty (50) respondents and a maximum of one hundred (100), with each province and/ or highly urbanized city equally represented.

## III. SURVEY DISTRIBUTION METHOD

The RC/SCWC Secretariat shall prepare the survey using google forms and google Document/word based on the template or outline issued by the Monitoring and Evaluation Division (MED) of the CWC. MED is recommending the following action points for the RC/SCWC:

- 1. Post the Google Form link to the online survey on the Facebook page of the RC/SCWCs
- Request RC/SCWC members (e.g. DepEd, DILG) to disseminate the survey through its respective issuances
- Distribute the survey in Google Form and documents through an Official Memorandum to the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) or the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children (PCPC).
  - a. The PSWDO or PCPC may administer the survey online or physically reproduce it for offline administration with assistance from the City or Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (C/MSWDO) or the Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC).

Even with the above recommendations, the RC/SCWC Secretariat is given the authority by the CWC to determine the best way to distribute the survey to partners or respondents.

## V. CONSENT FROM PARENT/GUARDIAN AND CHILD RESPONDENT

The survey administrator shall obtain consent from the parent or guardian of the child respondent by asking them to respond to the "consent" item in Section 1 (Description and Consent) of the survey.

If the parent or guardian answers "NO" to the question, the survey shall automatically end. If the parent or guardian answers "YES," the child will be asked to give consent. If the child answers "No," the survey will automatically end, but if the child responds "Yes," they may proceed to take the survey.

The child's participation in the survey is voluntary. The survey administrator shall not, in any way, coerce the parent or guardian and the child to give their consent to take the survey. The child can also decide to discontinue answering the survey at any given point.

# VII. CONSOLIDATION OF SURVEY RESULTS

The consolidated results shall be brought by regions belonging to Visayas and Mindanao clusters during the face-to-face Orientation and Writeshop on the Development of the Regional Situation Analysis on Children (RSAC) as one of the references during the workshops.

The regions from the North and South Luzon clusters shall present the survey results during their meeting with the RC/SCWC members in September 2022 and use it as additional reference in finalizing the draft of their RSAC. Results of the 2022 Philippine National Children's Conference (PNCC) and the Sustainable Development Goals Voluntary National Review (SDG-VNR) may be used first prior to the survey results.
