



- Must be fully vaccinated and are required to send a copy of vaccination card during registration.
- Must have attended Youth Volunteer Orientation Module training.
- · Must be physically and mentally fit.
- Should practice the minimum health protocols for the whole duration of the camp.
- Must declare any health-related problems they are experiencing during the camp. A
 health declaration form will be filled-in before the commencement of the daily
 activities.
- Must secure the following:

 Duly signed Child Protection Policy Code
- · Strictly NO REFUND once payment has been done.
- Registration Fee is NEITHER TRANSFERABLE NOR CONVERTIBLE.

Contests Guidelines and Criterias

TINGUG SANG RCY; A SONG WRITING COMPETITION

Mechanics:

- The competition is open to all bona fide campers of the Red Cross Youth Capiz Chapter 29th Summer Camp
- 2. Each entry should focus on a theme of the camp.
- 3. Each entry may be composed of one individual or may be a collaboration of up to three volunteers.
- **4.** The contestants are allowed to bring their own instruments on the day of the competition.
- Duration of the song must not be less than 3 minutes, and must not exceed 5 minutes.
- 6. Each entry must be an original composition of the contestant. Any form of plagiarism, copyright infringement, and ghost writing will be *disqualified*.
- 7. The lyrics can either be in Tagalog or English, or both.
- 8. Profanity and vulgar words are strictly prohibited.
- 9. The winning song of the competition will officially be the Red Cross Youth Capiz Chapter's official jingle and theme song. All entrants shall receive a certificate of participation.
- 10. Criteria are as follows;

SUGIDANON SANG PAMATAN-ON; A SPOKEN WORD POETRY COMPETITION

GUIDELINES FOR SPOKEN WORD POETRY

- 1. Spoken word poetry is a performance art that is word based. It is meant to be spoken or recited with emotion to an audience. It is an oral art that focuses on the art of word play, rhythm, improvisation, intonation, and voice inflection.
- 2. Participants must be a certified Red Cross Youth Member.
- 3. Participants must compose a piece that is related to this year's summer camp theme and must not contain any malicious and offensive content.
- 4. Participants must memorize the piece and deliver it within a minimum of 3 minutes and a maximum of 4 minutes. If the participant exceeds at most 30 seconds, 0.5 points will be deducted from their general weighted score, which implies a 1point deduction in 1 minute.
- 5. The piece must be submitted to the organizing committee on the first day of the summer camp.
- 6. Facial expression, hand and body gestures can be used to emphasize the different elements of the performance.
- 7. Bad language is strictly prohibited in the contest.
- 8. There should be one (1) representative per Council.
- 9. The spoken poetry must be an original composition and written in Hiligaynon.
- 10. Sounds or instrumental background are allowed to supplement the delivery. No deduction shall be made if the contestant chooses not to have musical background.

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING

- 1. Message/Content, 40%
 - The content of the spoken piece is relevant to the theme.
 - The piece has a powerful and meaningful message to the audience.
- 2. Delivery and Performance, 30%
 - The spoken piece is delivered from the heart.
 - Facial expression, hand and body gestures that emphasize the different elements of the performance.
 - Enunciation is clear. Audience can understand what is being spoken.
 - Words are pronounced distinctly and correctly.
- 3. Originality, 20%
 - o The piece must be an original composition by the contestant.
- 4. Overall Impact, 10%
 - The performer's physical appearance, voice and articulation, dramatic appropriateness, and evidence of understanding all seem on target and unified to breathe life into the piece.

PAINDISANAY - PINOY POP COMPETITION (P-POP)

RULES:

- 1. The piece must be Original Pilipino Music (OPM) composed by a Filipino composer and written in English or in a Filipino dialect.
- 2. The use of any types of instruments are allowed.
- 3. Setting up an equipment such as microphones are set up just 1 minute after the group artist is called. 2 points will be deducted for every 10 seconds.
- 4. The participants are free to choose any composition.
- 5. The number of performers must not be more than 8 and not less than 5 members.
- 6. Performance must not be more than 4 mins and not less than 2 mins.
- 7. Obscene costumes are strictly not allowed.
- 8. Remix music is not allowed.

PAINDISANAY SA KINAIYANG-ALAM; A QUIZ BEE COMPETITION

RULES AND MECHANICS

- The "Paindisanay sa Kinaiyang-Alam" is a quiz bee competition that will assess and evaluate the ideas and concepts of a volunteer regarding different fields of knowledge.
- 2. The contest is open to all bona fide and registered member of the Red Cross Youth Capiz.
- 3. Every participating council is allowed to send one (1) contestant.
- 4. The questions will come from the following areas:
 - (a) History of the Red Cross Movement;
 - (b) History of the Philippine Red Cross;
 - (c) 7 Fundamental Principles of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement;
 - (d) Basic First Aid
- 5. The quiz bee has three rounds: EASY, AVERAGE, and DIFFICULT. The number of items, time allotted, and points given to correct answers in different rounds are stated below.

- All questions will be read TWICE by the quizmaster. After the second reading,
 the quizmaster shall say the word "GO" to notify the participants that they may
 start answering the given question, with respect to the time allotted in every
 round.
- 7. Contestants will then answer in a bond paper and will use a marker in writing answers.
- 8. Changing of answers is allowed, making sure that it is still within the time allotted.
- 9. After the time limit and the buzzer sound, the contestants will stop answering and will raise their answers for verification.
- 10. The Verifying Team will then assess if the contestant got the right or wrong answer. The proctor assigned will publicly announce the result of the question in every candidate for scoring, while the Record Team will also publicly display the score tally every after question.
- 11. In case of a tie, a Clincher Round will be done. Contestants are given 15 seconds to answer the question. Each question is given 5 points each, and the first contestant to gain fifteen (15) points will win. In case that the competitors gained fifteen (15) points at the same time, another question shall be asked, and the first to answer will win. Questions will be asked until the tie is broken.
- 12. If in any case that a query was raised during the competition, it will be done in the following manner:
 - (a) Only the contestant and the official coach are allowed to raise queries regarding the question and answer.
 - (b) The query should be made before the next question is asked. Otherwise, the query will no longer be accepted.
- 13. The judges' decision is final, irrevocable, and unappealable.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Contestants are expected to bring long bond papers (cut in half, landscape) and a marker.
- 2. Contestants are expected to wear any semi-formal or smart casual attire during the competition and are required to wear face mask, observe proper distancing, and follow in health protocols implied by DOH and IATF.
- 3. Coaches are expected to register their contestant 5 days before the camp using a link that will be sent/relayed in the Council President.
- 4. Participants should be present in the contest venue EARLIER than the starting time.
- 5. Coaches are not allowed to have any form of communication with their respective contestants once the competition has begun.

IMAHINASYON MANGIN INSPIRASYON; POSTER MAKING CONTEST

RULES:

- 1. Theme of the poster: "Be a volunteer"
- 2. There should be 2 participants in each participating council.
- 3. The participants will be given 2 hours to finish the poster.
- 4. The materials will be provided by the facilitators: ½ Illustration board, Crayons, 2 Pencils, and Sharpener.
- 5. There will be questions after the poster is finished.
- 6. 2 points will be deducted if one of the participants will be late. 3 minutes late will be automatically disqualified.

Strictly no copying from the internet. Copying from the internet will be having a 5 points deduction.

FIRST AID COMPETITION CRITERIA

- 1. Only a bona fide camper of the Philippine Red Cross Youth Capiz Chapter's 29th Summer Camp may join the First Aid Competition.
- 2. A total of four (4) participants may join per council.
- 3. Only one (1) triangular bandage per participant is allowed for the competition.
- 4. The First Aid Competition will be judged with the following categories; Bandaging, Immobilizing, and Lifting.
- 5. Only two (2) from the four participants may join for each category. One will act as the first-aider, and the other as the patient.
- 6. A speaker will give two (2) situations for Bandaging, one (1) situation for Immobilizing, and one (1) situation for Lifting.
- 7. Each situation will give fifteen (15) seconds for the participant to solve and aid their patient.
- 8. Each situation is graded ten (10) points by the judge. Accumulating the entire contest to have fourty (40) points.
- 9. The council with the highest score wins.

MR. & MISS RED CROSS YOUTH CAPIZ

A. Over-all Guidelines

- 1. The candidates must be a certified Red Cross Youth Member from their council and stands at least 5'2" tall for female and 5'4" for males.
- Each council must only have one male and one female representative for the pageant. The participating team shall be responsible for screening the candidates in accordance to the rules and guidelines set by the organizers.
- 3. The contestants, upon the endorsement of their respective team must fill-in the official entry form on the date specified by the organizers.
- 4. Official candidates have to attend the general orientation with their council adviser on July , 2023 at _____.
- The official candidates with the Red Cross Youth Capiz Chapter Publication Committee will have a photoshoot on _____ at ____ to be used in selecting the Mr.and Ms. Photogenic as well as for social media campaign and promotion.
- 6. In regard with the talent competition:
 - · Candidates should perform their talent by pair.
 - No back-up performers and no backdrops will be allowed during the competition.
 - The use of fire and eating of foods or live animals are not allowed.
 - Costume should be appropriate to the talent.
 - The performance should have a maximum of four (4) minutes including the entrance and exit.
 - Three (3) points deduction from the total score will be implemented to any candidate/s who violate rules and guidelines during the talent competition.
- 7. The organizing committee has the right to call the attention of the candidates in cases of any untoward behavior that would cause disturbance of the scheduled activity.
- 8. Attires of the candidate/s in each category shouldn't be vulgar.
- 9. Only one (1) official coach and one (1) Makeup artist is allowed each competing contestant is allowed at the back stage during the pageant night.
- 10. In cases where a tie occurs, deliberation between the members of the board of judges will be done to break the tie.
- 11. Candidate/s will be subject to a rightful disciplinary measure, if a candidate/s had shown or manifested any behavioral issues and actions within the period of the competition.
- 12. The decision of board of judges are final and irrevocable.
- 13. Determination of top five (5) both male and female will be based on the following percentage:

- 1. The presentation of the Red and White collection shall heed the following guidelines:

 - Delegates must be able to project their own personal sense of style.
 - Delegates must wear appropriate selection of outfit in their red and white collection.
 - The value of the outfit should complement the contestant's individuality.
 - Modeling should be simple and not overly complicated. Turns and 'poses' are fine, but no "Pro-am" modeling.

- 1. The following are the guidelines for the Improvised Barong Tagalog and Terno.

 - Sharps, broken glass, metals and other materials that could harm the model are strictly prohibited.
 - All design must be descent and not revealing, as well as could support the weight of the materials to be used.
 - Models are not allowed to strip/remove any clothing during the run away

 - Remember that they shall be modeling the clothing they are wearing.
 - Violation to this rule shall lead to automatically 5-points deduction in general weighted score.
