CDRC opens 2023 poster-making contest

The Citizens' Disaster Response Center Foundation, Inc. (CDRC) is inviting Filipino youth aged seven to 12 to submit entries to its 2023 annual poster-making contest.

Titled Apoy, Bagyo, Kalamidad: Dibuhong Pambata (#ABKD), this is CDRC's 28th annual contest held to recognize children's capacity and advocacy of disaster and risk management in households, schools, and communities.

ABKD is divided into two categories: **Category A** is open to **children ages 7 to 9**, where they are expected to express their ideas on disaster preparedness on any of the following subjects: typhoons or floods, volcanic eruption or lahar, earthquake, fire, landslide or trash slide, and damage to the environment brought about by large-scale mining, illegal logging and other controversial development projects.

Category B is open to children aged 10 to 12. Artworks under this category should focus on any of the following subjects: drought, red tide or fish kill, infestation, outbreak of diseases or epidemic, armed conflict, and climate change.

Participants should choose only **ONE** theme per artwork in their category. All artworks should be drawn on a ¼ **illustration board**, on a landscape orientation, and must indicate category and disaster type. Participants should give their entries a title and a caption.

Entries should be submitted with the contestant's name, age, address, telephone number, school's name, grade level, and other important information. Incomplete details and not following the contest mechanics will result in automatic disqualification of entries.

Entries must be submitted to CDRC no later than **September 30**, **2023** (**Saturday**). For other information, please check ABKD posters and flyers posted in our official Facebook Page, or call CDRC at (02) 8929-9820 / 22.

1. Think of ways you can help your community reduce risk of disasters. Express your ideas on a poster.

2. Choose only **ONE** theme per artwork in your category.

3. Send a short video to @cdrc1984 (Messenger or Instagram), capturing the kids doing their artwork.

- 1. Use any medium. Design should be drawn on a ¼ illustration board (20" X 15").
- 2. Indicate category and disaster type.
- 3. Put titles and captions.
- 4. Contest entries should be covered by plastic when submitted.
- 5. There should be NO text on the artwork.
- 6. The artwork should be in a landscape orientation.

WINNERS

- o There will be one (1) major prize.
- o Awarding of winners is (to be announced).
- Winners will be informed through phone or by letter/e-mail.
- Major prize winners will get Php 5,000 cash prize each. Other winners will receive Php 2,000 each. Prizes not claimed within six (6) months will be forfeited.
- Winning entries shall become CDRC property and will be featured in the 2024 CDRC Disaster Preparedness Calendar and other promotional materials.
- Non-winning entries can be reclaimed at the CDRC office. Entries not claimed within 60 days after the announcement of winners shall be considered donations to CDRC.

CONTEST LIMITS

- Each participant can submit a maximum of two (2) entries.
- Two-time winners of ABKD are not qualified to join anymore.
- Posters that have won or have been submitted in other contests will not be accepted.
