

APPROVAL OF THE SCHOOL/COMMUNITY HEAD

Establishment of a Red Cross Youth Council must have a permission from the Principal/ President/ Administrator (School) or Local Chief Executive (Community).



APPOINTMENT OF RCY ADVISERS

Choosing of a focal persons who will serve as coordinators between the Council and the local Red Cross Chapter and will assist the youth.



ORIENTATION



Red Cross Youth refers to any young person, aged 7 to 30 years old, who has completed the induction courses prescribed under the Youth Volunteer Formation Course; has been

enrolled in the Membership and Accident Assistance Benefit Program; and has pledged as a youth member volunteer of the Philippine Red Cross. It collectively represents the sixth major services of the Philippine Red Cross and is dedicated towards the development of the youth as agents of change and humanitarian leaders through direct involvement in various humanitarian actions.

MISSION

To educate and empower the children and youth in the spirit of the Red Cross through relevant training and effective leadership and provide opportunities for directing and harnessing their energy and idealism into worthwhile humanitarian activities.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Inculcation of Humanitarian Values
- The organization promotes the inculcation of humanitarian values and principles to enable them to live by them and be guided as they take future roles as humanitarian leaders.
- 2. Instill the Practice of Healthy Lifestyle
 The organization aims to help build
 healthier communities through youth
 participation as agents of behavioral change
 in health promotion.

- 3. Enhance Youth Leadership Skills through Service Delivery
- The youth's leadership potential is honed by providing opportunities for direct involvement in the delivery of development and humanitarian services.
- 4. Advocate National/International Friendship
- Young volunteers and leaders take part in promoting friendship and solidarity through intercultural and intergenerational dialogues and initiatives.

CLASSIFICATION

- 1. Junior Red Cross (JRC)
- This is the Red Cross Youth Council that composed of members and elected officers who are enrolled as Kinder to Grade 6 students. This council may take in out-of-school children with members ages 7 12 years old.
- 2. Senior Red Cross Youth (SRCY)
- This is the Red Cross Youth Council for members and elected officers within the Junior High School from grades 7 to 10.
- 3. Senior Plus Red Cross Youth (SPRCY)
- This is the Red Cross Youth Council that composed of members and elected officers who are enrolled as grades 11 to 12 students.
- 4. College Red Cross Youth (CRCY)
- This council is based in the college or university level and is composed of members and elected officers who are officially enrolled.
- 5. Community Red Cross Youth (ComRCY)
- This council is based in the communities and is composed of young adult professionals or out of school youth ages 7 to 30 years old. This can be in a municipal or barangay level.
