Played with quiet strength and grace by \*Morissette Amon, this is Alma's story of perseverance, passion, and purpose.

From the rural town of Loboc, this little choir would grow to represent the Philippines on the world stage, gaining recognition for their pure sound, discipline, and the Filipino soul in every note.

Alongside Morissette, the film features a powerhouse cast, including the timeless *Rachel Alejandro*, who also delivers one of the movie's most moving musical duets with Morissette —

# Meet the Public School Teacher Who Founded a World-Class Choir and Inspired a Movie

For Alma Taldo, it's nice to have a great voice but she requires commitment.

(SPOT.ph) "Nang pinakita ni Ma'am Girlie 'yung script sa akin, sabi ko 'Puwede ba hindi na gamitin ang pangalan ko? Ibang pangalan na lang."

Alma Taldo, founder and director of the world-renowned Loboc Children's Choir (LCC), was never comfortable being in the limelight. So when "Ma'am Girlie" Rodis and Celeste Legaspi of Culturtain Musicat Productions told her they were interested to make a film about the LCC's inspiring journey from small town choral group to world-traveling Filipino talent, she felt uneasy.

But Legaspi and Rodis—the powerhouse duo behind original Filipino musicals *Katy* and *Larawan*— were able to convince the Boholano educator to allow them to use her name in the movie, *Song of the Fireflies*.

Song of the Fireflies is directed by King Palisoc (*Tandem*), and written by Sarge Lacuesta (*An Errand*). The film's credits boast other respected figures in the arts and entertainment. There's Rachel Alejandro who plays staunch music and art patron Enriqueta Butalid, and singer Morisette who debuts as an actress in the film playing Alma Taldo. Behind the featured songs are a bunch of boldfaced names in Philippine music -- Ryan Cayabyab, Louie Ocampo, Raimund Marasigan, and Itchyworms' Jazz Nicolas. When you have this kind of roster of artists behind a film, you know the story must be really special. And it is—and it all began with one humble, dedicated teacher.
