**2025 DIVISION SCHOOLS PRESS CONFERENCE FOR FILIPINO AND ENGLISH
(ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY LEVELS)**

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent

1. Pursuant to Republic Act (RA) No. 7079, also known as the Campus Journalism Act of 1991, this Office announces the conduct of the **2025-2026 Division Schools Press Conference (DSPC) for Filipino and English (Elementary and Secondary Level)** with the theme **“Empowering Truth, Building Resilience: Campus Journalism in the Face of Disasters.”** This year’s DSPC will be conducted at Capiz National High School on the following dates:

- a. December 6, 2025 - Group contests (Elementary & Secondary)
- b. December 13, 2025- Individual contests (Elementary)
- c. December 14, 2025- Individual contest (Secondary)

2. The conference aims to:

- a. demonstrate understanding of journalism through skillful execution in various platforms (i.e., print, broadcast, online);
- b. recognize the role of journalism in advocating for social consciousness and environmental awareness;
- c. foster camaraderie and enrich learning experiences through healthy and friendly competitions; and
- d. provide learners opportunities to use the skills learned on campus journalism for their future careers.

3. Learners at the elementary and secondary levels (both junior and senior high schools) both public and private schools are eligible to join the contests.

4. There are nine (9) official individual categories to be joined in namely: **News, Sports, Editorial, Feature, Editorial Cartooning, Copyreading**



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and Headline Writing, Photojournalism, Science, and Column Writing; and five (5) official group contest categories namely: Radio Scriptwriting and Broadcasting (English and Filipino, Elementary and Secondary), Collaborative Desktop Publishing (English and Filipino, Elementary and Secondary), Online Publishing (English and Filipino, Secondary only), TV Scriptwriting and Broadcasting (English and Filipino, Secondary only), School Paper Contests (English and Filipino, Elementary and Secondary). This year, Mobile Journalism (MoJo), English and Filipino, will be added as an exhibition contest during the individual categories for the secondary level only.

5. A search for the Outstanding School Paper Adviser (Elementary and Secondary), and Outstanding Campus Journalist (Elementary and Secondary) will also be held.

6. The group contest categories, namely, Radio and TV Scriptwriting and Broadcasting, Collaborative Desktop Publishing, and Online Publishing contests, shall be held on a separate venue and date to cater to the availability of the resource persons for the presscon, facilitators, and judges. Each school/district shall have one (1) team composed of seven (7) members in either English or Filipino, except for Online Publishing with only five (5) members.

7. Contestants should bring their laptops, printers, and extension cords, and a storage box for safety keeping. **There will be a checking of all laptops to be used in these categories on December 5, 2025, 1PM, at Capiz National High School.** Every laptop must be cleared of all files to ensure fairness during the competition proper.

8. Entries for the **school paper contest** must submit their online copy in Portable Document Format (PDF) of their school paper on or before **December 10, 2025, 11:59 PM** directly to the Google Drive link to be provided by the Capiz Division School Paper Advisers Association.

9. Contestants in photojournalism are allowed to use **point-and-shoot, compact cameras, or DSLR cameras with a prime lens or zoom lens up to 105 mm ONLY.** Those who will use other cameras with long lenses or do not follow the given specifications will not be permitted to join the contest.



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10. For the elementary level, there will be a maximum of five (5) contestants for each category from each district. For the secondary and integrated schools, there will be one contestant for each category from each school. Participants are advised to bring packed lunch and snacks.

11. **A membership fee of One Hundred Pesos Only (Php. 100.00)** shall be collected from each participating campus journalist and school paper adviser/coach which shall be paid directly to the treasurer of the Division School Paper Advisers and Campus Journalists on the day of the contest.

12. Only **one (1) official event** in the individual or group category is allowed. In the case of Mobile Journalism for the secondary, participants may come from group contests to assure their chances of reaching the next level but must not be joining any individual contests, as these will be held simultaneously.

13. The **top ten (10) winners** shall be declared in all official individual contests and will earn a slot for the upcoming Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC). However, only the **top five (5) winners** shall be recognized for the group contest categories, while ONLY the **top two (2)** can join the Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC).

14. To ensure a smooth flow of the conduct of this year's DSPC, all the identified facilitators and members of the Technical Working Group (TWG), including the officers of the Capiz Division School Papers Association, shall convene on **December 2, 2025**, in a venue to be announced later.

15. The Contest Matrix and Guidelines are found in Enclosures Nos. 1 -9 as well as the updated guidelines for all contest categories, including the Mobile Journalism.

16. Teacher participants and facilitators are entitled to service credits in accordance with DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 titled: Updated Guidelines on the grants of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers. On the other hand, Non-Teaching personnel including the manager staff shall be provided with Compensatory Time Off (CTO) as per Civil Service Commission (CSC) and Department of Budget (DBM) Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004 on Non-Monetary Remuneration for Overtime Service Rendered.

17. The criteria for judging the categories mentioned above is based on **DepEd Memorandum No. 39, Series of 2025**.
18. Campus journalists must secure a waiver or permit signed by the parents.
19. Expenses relative to the conduct of the DSPC shall be charged against the Division MOOE Fund. Membership fee, per diem, and transportation expenses of participants are chargeable against the school MOOE, School Paper Fund, and other available funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
19. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

ANNEX A

**GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE INDIVIDUAL CONTESTS
(ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY LEVEL)**

A. Individual Writing Contest and Editorial Cartooning

1. Each participant shall be given one hour to finish his/her work. Proctors shall retrieve all writing sheets at the end of the period provided.
2. Official writing sheets, or paper for the cartooning, shall be provided by the committee.
3. All participants are required to bring their School ID and/or campus publication ID for proper identification.
4. Copyreaders are required to use pencils.
5. Cartoonists are required to use Mongol 2 pencils. Other specialized pencils are not allowed.
6. Cellular phones should be kept inside the learners' bags or left to their advisers.
7. All participants shall write their control number on the upper right portion of their official contest paper, which is based on their attendance record and pre-registration form. No other identifiable marks shall be put on any part of the answer sheet apart from the control number. Any marks of name and school will be a ground for disqualification.

B. Photojournalism

1. Contestants must be at the venue 30 minutes before the contest proper for the orientation.
2. Contestants are allowed to use point-and-shoot, compact cameras or DSLR cameras with a prime lens or zoom lens up to 105mm ONLY. Those who will use other cameras with long lenses or do not follow the given specifications will not be permitted to join the contest.



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3. Contestants must submit a camera with emptied internal memory for checking.
4. Cellular phones, extra digital cameras, or any other additional materials/equipment are not allowed in the contest area.
5. Contestants must bring their own black ballpen and folder for writing the caption.
6. The loading and unloading of the storage card will be done in front of the examiner.
7. The control shot is considered the first shot.
8. Contestants are given one hour to take pictures. The loading and unloading of the memory cards shall be done in front of the contest facilitator.
9. Contestants are allowed to take unlimited shots but will submit the control shot and the five photos with caption related to the given theme.
10. Entries that have been edited and/or manipulated which include but not limited to retouching, cropping, stitching, changing the colors and hues, adjusting brightness, contrast, and saturation will not be accepted.
11. Contestants will be given 30 minutes to provide a caption for each of the five photos.
12. The advisers, trainers, and parents are NOT allowed in the contest venue throughout the duration of the competition.



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ANNEX B
GUIDELINES IN MOBILE JOURNALISM
(FOR EXHIBITION ONLY – SECONDARY)

1. The Mobile Journalism Exhibition aims to empower campus journalists to create, edit, and produce timely and relevant news features with the use of just their smartphones, hence without the expense of traditional high-cost equipment.
2. This exhibition is open to learners at the secondary level. **For the DSPC, a pair of participants shall represent their respective schools.** One pair of participants will represent their school in English, and another pair will do so in Filipino. The participant must not be joining other competitions in the individual contests. Preferably, the pair must come from separate group contests or may be formed from non-competing contestants in individual contests.
3. The participants will be given time to shoot, edit, and produce one video story (portrait) per pair on a topic that will be provided by the Division Management Committee.
4. Each entry must be recorded, edited, and completed with any smartphone running on iOS or Android and using any video-editing application.
5. Each entry must run for 1 to 2 minutes and revolve around the topic that will be provided on the day of the conference, prior to the opening program. The preparation time is 4 hours.
6. All submissions must be original and free from any intellectual property/copyright issues.
7. All participants must attest that they are submitting work produced with only smartphones and mobile applications. The Board of Judges reserves the right to disqualify entries that cannot be verified at their absolute discretion.
8. Only the Top 10 winners shall be recognized in every medium but points will not be counted in the overall ranking of school.
9. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.

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ANNEX C

GUIDELINES FOR THE COLLABORATIVE DESKTOP PUBLISHING CONTEST

(Based on DepEd Memorandum No. 39, Series of 2025)

1. Each school shall organize a team of seven (7) members for English and Filipino both in elementary and secondary levels.
2. Contestants shall wear white shirts with identification cards.
3. All contestants are required to attend the one-hour orientation before the competition.
4. All contestants are not allowed to go back to their quarters nor communicate in all forms (text, call, chat, etc.) with their respective advisers from the start until the end of the contest.
5. A video recorded mini press conference and a sports event shall be held as bases for the content of the publication (i.e., news, features, editorial, editorial cartoon, sports). The photojournalists shall take pictures of the mini press conference and sports event, or as instructed by the facilitator.
6. The team will be given one (1) hour for data gathering and five (5) hours for writing, layout, and editing.
7. Each team is allowed to bring only the following:
 - two (2) digital/DSLR cameras;
 - one (1) inkjet printer with scanner;
 - one (1) card reader;
 - one (1) blank flash drive;
 - extension wires;
 - maximum of four (4) laptops installed with either Pagemaker or InDesign and photoshop (for the secondary level) and Microsoft Publisher (for the elementary level) for the layout of the group's final output and
 - A4 size bond paper.
8. Official laptops, previously cleared of stored documents, must be submitted to the DTWG before the contest to check for any applications, pre-written documents, or references. Laptops to be submitted to the DTWG shall be labeled with the following format:

Category - Medium-Level_School Name



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(e.g.) Collaborative Desktop Publishing - English - Secondary _ Capiz NHS
Labels shall be in a whole bond paper size pasted on or attached to the laptop bag.

9. Mobile phones and other electronic gadgets shall not be allowed except for digital cameras/DSLRs and laptops with disabled internet connection.
10. Each team will be required to convert their output into PDF, print in A4 size-bond paper, and submit it to the examiner/s. They should ensure that no identifying marks about their school can be found on their output as it would be a ground for disqualification.
11. The output of the contest is an A4-size four-page full-colored publication. The output will be stored in a flash drive provided by the examiner/s and uploaded to the designated computer for judging.
12. Entries must be judged according to the criteria stipulated in DepEd Memorandum No. 39, Series of 2025 for the NSPC Guidelines in Collaborative Desktop Publishing:

Content	-	50%
Technicals	-	40%
Ethics	-	<u>10%</u>
Total	-	100%

13. The following special awards may be given: Best News Page, Best Feature Page, Best Editorial Page, Best Sports Page, and Best Layout.
14. The top five (5) teams shall be recognized, and their points will be included in the determination of the overall scores.
15. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.

ANNEX D

GUIDELINES FOR ONLINE PUBLISHING CONTEST

(Based on DepEd Memorandum No. 39, Series of 2025)

1. Each school shall organize a team of five (5) members for English and Filipino both in elementary and secondary levels who shall not be competing in any of the individual writing categories.
2. Contestants shall wear white shirts with identification cards.
3. All contestants are required to attend the orientation before the competition.
4. All contestants are not allowed to go back to their quarters nor communicate in all forms (text, call, chat, etc.) with their respective advisers from the start until the end of the contest.
5. A video recorded mini press conference and a sports event shall be held as bases for the content of the publication (i.e., news, features, editorial, editorial cartoon, sports). The photojournalists shall take pictures of the mini press conference and sports event.
6. The team will be given four (4) hours for writing, layout, and editing articles to create an online publication using the official platform to be provided by the organizer (WordPress). Coverage and the data gathering if there will be a mini-press conference, pre-game, actual game, and post-game conference shall be excluded from the 4-hour time allotment.
7. Specific number of articles to be produced will be given during the orientation.
8. Each them will be required to bring only the following:
 - one (1) flatbed scanner/3-1 printer (mobile/phone scanner is NOT allowed);
 - two digital/DSLR cameras (Standard process in the photojournalism event will be observed in checking the cameras and SD cards.);
 - maximum of four (4) laptops installed with photoshop for image enhancement;
 - maximum of two (2) pocket WiFis (preferably with two different networks) or one (1) wireless router; and
 - extension cord.



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9. Official laptops, previously cleared of stored documents, must be submitted to the DTWG before the contest to check for any applications, pre-written documents, or references. Laptops shall be labeled with the following format:

Category - Medium-Level_School Name
(e.g.) Online Publishing - English - Secondary _ Capiz NHS
Labels shall be in a whole bond paper size pasted on or attached to the laptop bag.

10. Each group shall email their URL to the assigned examiner.

11. Entries must be judged according to the criteria stipulated in DepEd Memorandum No. 25, Series of 2024 for the NSPC Guidelines in Online Publishing:

Content	-	30%
Language and Style	-	15%
Layout	-	20%
Technicals	-	20%
Ethics	-	<u>15%</u>
Total	-	100%

12. The following special awards may be given: Best News Page, Best Feature Page, Best Editorial Page, Best Sports Page, and Best Web Design Management/Layout.

13. The top five (5) teams shall be recognized, and their points will be included in the determination of the overall scores.

14. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.



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ANNEX E

GUIDELINES FOR THE RADIO SCRIPTWRITING AND BROADCASTING CONTEST

(Based on DepEd Memorandum No. 39, Series of 2025)

A. General Guidelines

1. Each region must form a team of seven English and Filipino members at the elementary and secondary levels who are not competing in any of the individual and other team categories.
2. Participants must wear a plain white shirt with their valid school ID/NSPC IDs for proper identification.
3. The awards for this category include the following:
Individual Awards - Best Anchor, Best News Presenter, Best Technical Director
Group Awards - Best Infomercial, Best Script, Best Radio Broadcast
4. Contestants are not allowed to have mobile phones, smart gadgets, reference materials, or any extra sheets of paper in the contest area.
5. All teams must ensure that their laptop/device is compatible with the available device/s in the designated simulation area. This shall be done during the mock radio production.
6. Official laptops must be cleared of stored documents before submitting to the DTWG. Failure to clear the stored documents will result in the disqualification of the competing team..
7. Any violation of the stipulated guidelines will be grounds for the disqualification of the team.
8. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.



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B. Scriptwriting

1. Each team may use up to four official laptops and one flash drive (at most 32gb) that have been cleared of stored documents and printer in preparing and printing of the script. All laptops must be submitted to the contest committee for inspection. Each team must also bring their own extension cords and other equipment for rehearsal.
2. The team will have one hour and 30 minutes to write a script for a five-minute radio broadcast, which will include one infomercial and four news articles.
3. The infomercial may cover topics such as health, environment, politics, social issues, and other relevant subjects to be determined by the judges. It should not exceed one minute in length and must be in the same medium the group is competing in.

The news articles shall be based on press releases, raw data, or any other sources handed by the examiner/s. The news articles should be based on the sources/materials provided by the judges.

An additional 30 minutes will be allotted for printing. After two hours, each team should submit four copies of the script. Three copies will be submitted to the judges, and one copy will be submitted to the examiner/s. The team may print extra copies for their own use.

4. Once the script writing has begun, the contestants will no longer be allowed to leave the contest rooms. For personal necessities, the proctor will accompany them to the restrooms.
5. The script should not contain any information that could identify the contestants, their school, division, or region; however, it should include the names of the team members along with their respective roles (e.g., anchor, news presenter, etc.). Violation of this procedure shall be grounds for disqualification.
6. The board of judges will provide the name of the radio station, program title, and kilohertz frequency, which will be uniform to all groups.



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7. Scripts should be:

- encoded using Arial font size 12
- with directorial instructions in capital letters
- double-spaced with normal margin (1 inch on all sides)
- printed in A4-sized bond paper (8.27x11.69 inches)

C. Broadcast Simulation

1. A designated broadcast room will be identified in the contest venue for the presentation. Only the contestants, judges, and the examiner/s are allowed inside.
2. The organizers/host school must hire an independent sound system provider to ensure high-quality audio output. The technical operator shall only set the sound system before the simulation. A jack/auxiliary cord/adapter will be provided for laptops and other sources of sound effects.
3. Contestants/technical directors are not allowed to change, adjust, and manipulate the main control board during their presentation, except for the volume meter.
4. In the event of a power failure, the affected team will be allowed to broadcast again.
5. The use of sound bites/recording, recorded prior to the contest proper or simulation is prohibited.
6. At least two loudspeakers may be set up outside the broadcast room.
7. The host school shall provide the radio frequency or Podcast/social media link where the broadcast simulation will be tuned in, provided that only AUDIO will be aired.
8. A designated holding area shall be provided for each role. Teams shall not be allowed to meet outside their designated areas for rehearsals. Violation of this procedure shall be grounds for disqualification.
9. Each team is given ten minutes: three minutes for preparation, five minutes for the actual broadcast, and two minutes for exit. The provided running time shall be applied. Preparation time shall be paused if the team experiences a technical problem/glitch. If the technical problem has not been resolved after five minutes, the next group will present.



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10. The host region shall provide a timer that can be seen by the contestants and the judges. An official timekeeper will be appointed.

11. A yellow flaglet will be raised to signal that the team has one minute left for preparation. A green flaglet will then be raised to signal the team to start. A yellow flaglet will be raised again to warn the team that they have only one minute remaining, followed by a red flaglet to indicate that their time is up.

12. If there is a case of overtime/undertime during the specified broadcast duration, points will be deducted based on the following criteria for adherence to time allotment (5%):

Overtime/Undertime

1-15 seconds (1 point)
16-45 seconds (2 point)
46-90 seconds (3 point)
91-120 seconds (4 point)



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ANNEX F

GUIDELINES FOR THE TV SCRIPTWRITING AND BROADCASTING CONTEST

(Based on DepEd Memorandum No. 39, Series of 2025)

The contest aims to promote collaboration among campus journalists and simulate the workplace of a television news production department.

A. General Guidelines

1. Each school must form a team of seven members for English and seven for Filipino in secondary level who are not competing in any of the individual writing categories.
2. The members should have the following roles/tasks, including but not limited to:
 - a. scriptwriter/s
 - b. anchor/s
 - c. reporter/s
 - d. producer/director who could also act as floor director
 - e. video/graphics editor
 - f. video journalist/camera man

Any team member can take on multiple roles, as long as it does not create conflicts or awkwardness in the outcome of the broadcast (e.g., an anchor cannot also be a reporter simultaneously. However, an anchor can also serve as a news or infomercial writer).

3. With the unavailability of equipment and tools to be used for a live broadcast, the Division TWG opted for outputs to be submitted as canned video materials only, provided that they adhere to the set guidelines.
4. In getting the overall results for the best TV broadcast, accumulated points from the individual and group awards shall be considered.
5. The awards for this category include the following:
Individual Awards - Best Anchor, Best Reporter, Best Director
Group Awards - Best Technical Application (Editing/Scoring), Best Developmental Communication, Best News Script, Best TV Newscast

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6. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.
7. Any violation of the stipulated guidelines will be a ground for disqualification of the team.

PRE-CONTEST

A. Checking and Sealing of Devices and Gadgets

1. Each team must bring ONLY the following:
 - a. Contest Laptops - A maximum of FOUR contest laptops is allowed. These must NOT contain any file or document, EXCEPT for:
 - i. installed offline editing software/s free of ongoing/unfinished templates and projects; and
 - ii. preproduced/prerecorded videos and audios (OBB and/or CBB, TV Network and Program Logos, stingers and audio web, lower thirds with/without animation, graphics, audio and video elements for newscast).
 - b. Cameras - a maximum of TWO video-shooting devices (i.e., 2 DSLR cameras/1 DSLR camera and 1 mobile camera/2 mobile cameras) compatible with the contest laptops are allowed. Mobile phones must NOT have SIM card (physical/electronic), must be in factory settings, and have NO installed photo and video-editing
 - c. Storage Device - three empty flash drives (at least 16 GB) and two empty memory cards for camera/s are allowed.
 - d. One inkjet printer
 - e. A4-size bond paper
 - f. Extension cord/s
2. Laptops, flash drives, and other equipment to be submitted to the DTWG should be labeled in the following format:
Category - Medium-Level_School Name
Labels shall be in a whole bond paper size pasted on or attached to the laptop bag.



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3. Official laptops must be cleared of stored documents, aside from those listed in 1A, before submitting to the DTWG.
4. Failing to clear the stored documents and to submit the laptops on the set deadline will disqualify the competing team.

CONTEST PROPER

A. CONTEST REORIENTATION

1. Claiming of sealed devices and gadgets shall be done before the contest reorientation. Only the claimed devices and gadgets are allowed to be used during the contest proper.
2. Each team can bring ONLY a tumbler/water canister (optional) and a pen and paper placed inside a clear envelope on the day of the event. No bags are allowed within the working room.
3. All gadgets must be turned off and surrendered to the assigned proctor for each region upon arrival at the contest venue.

B. SCRIPTWRITING AND PRODUCTION

1. Each school is assigned a working room by the proctors.
2. The team should include the following components in their script:
 - a. **Cover page:** This page should contain the group's name (mock TV network name)
 - b. **News:** Only the five sets of data provided by the DTWG will be used in the news reports. Each news script should specify the corresponding video and/or audio component extracted from the folders or created during the actual contest.
 - c. **Infomercial/Developmental Communication:** The team must create one infomercial or developmental communication plug with a maximum duration of 60 seconds. The NTWG will provide two sets of data (photos/videos/audio) in folders saved in a flash drive. However, each team is also allowed to take footage/s within the designated area to be used in the infomercial.

The script should contain video and audio components.

- d. **Field Report:** The production must include a live field report with or without canned video support.



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e. **Headlines:** These will contain a brief but concise lead/summary the news articles.. OBB/CBB: The NTWG will provide TV station and program names, uniform to all groups. The TV Stations and Program Names are follows:

TV Broadcasting English Network Name: DSPC TV Program Name: Campus Patrol
TV Broadcasting Filipino Network Name: DSPC TV Program Name: Kampus Konek

3. Four hours will be allotted for the pre-production (story conference and scriptwriting), actual production (video shooting/recording, infomercial production), post-production (editing), and rehearsal. Each team is given six minutes for the actual broadcast.
4. Once scriptwriting begins, contestants are not allowed to leave the contest venue. For personal needs, the proctor will accompany them to the nearest restrooms.
5. Each team must submit four copies of the script: three for the judges and one for the DTWG. Additional copies for team use may be printed.
6. The cover page of the script must reflect the TV Network and Program names (as provided by the DTWG), and the names of the team members with their respective roles (i.e., anchor, field reporter, etc.).
7. The script should not contain any information that could identify the contestants, their school, division, or region.
8. All teams must stop working after the allotted four-hour time limit. A buzzer signals the end of the scriptwriting and production time.
9. A designated holding area shall be provided for each role.
10. Team members are only allowed to leave the room when it is their turn to perform or for personal needs under the supervision of a proctor.
11. During the six-minute broadcast time, an official timekeeper will give the following signals using colored flaglets to the broadcasting team:
12. If there is a case of overtime/undertime during the specified broadcast duration, points will be deducted based on the following criteria for adherence to time allotment (5%):

Overtime/Undertime



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1-15 seconds (1 point)
16-45 seconds (2 point)
46-90 seconds (3 point)
91-120 seconds (4 point)

9. The timekeeper will furnish the judges with a record of each group's broadcast running time immediately after their performance. The record will detail the number of seconds/minutes each group exceeded or fell short of the allotted time.
10. Three minutes will be allotted for the exit.

(ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY LEVEL)**

- A. Each Division School Paper Advisers Association and Division Secondary and Elementary Editors Guild in cooperation with the Department of Education – SDO Capiz shall select one outstanding campus journalist each for elementary and secondary to represent in the region.
- B. The panel of judges shall be composed of the following: the Division EPS – English and Filipino, Division Journalism Coordinator, and the President of the Division School Paper Advisers Association.
- C. The school shall submit the nomination together with the photocopy of all documents duly certified true and correct by the School Principal for verification and evaluation by the Division Search Committee. A school may only send one (1) nominee.
- D. The following factors shall be considered in the selection. The candidate who got the highest accumulated points will be declared as the Outstanding Campus Journalist.
- E. There will be no panel interview to be conducted in the Division level as only the submitted documents shall be the basis for selection. But, in case of a tie in the initial counting of points, the interview might be conducted as scheduled.
- F. The Search for the Outstanding Campus Journalist in SDO-Capiz shall be evaluated on the following criteria (Reference: DepEd RM 393, s. 2024).

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ANNEX I

B. The top five (5) highest pointers both in English and Filipino shall be declared as the best school papers in the SDO-Capiz and their points will be added to determine the best-performing school for the group contests.

C. For any school paper found to have copied and published texts, images, and other materials without duly acknowledging their sources, the following sanctions shall be applied:

First Offense: Disqualification from the contest

Second Offense: A formal notification shall be sent to the School Principal and the concerned school paper adviser shall undergo a refresher course on plagiarism. Accordingly, the school head shall implement plans and programs on academic honesty and integrity.

D. The decision of the Board of Judges in all aspects of the contest shall be deemed final and irrevocable.

E. The different **SECTIONS/CATEGORIES** in the school paper contest, both English and Filipino, are as follows:

1. News Section/Pahinang Balita
2. Editorial Section/Pahinang Editorial
3. Features Section/Pahinang Lathalaín
4. Sports Section/Pahinang Pampalakasan
5. Science & Technology Section/Pahinang Agham at Teknolohiya
6. Layout & Page Design Category/Kategoryang Pag-aanyo at Disenyo ng Pahina

F. The technical specifications for both Elementary and Secondary levels are as follows:

1. No. of pages: minimum of 8 and maximum of 20



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News Section- at least three (3)
Sports Section - at least two (2)
Feature Section - at least three (3)
Editorial Section - at least two (2)
Science and Technology Section - at least two (2)

3. Colored
4. Size: 9"x12" for elementary; 12"x18" for secondary

G. Failure to comply with the set guidelines in evaluating school papers will be a ground for disqualification.
